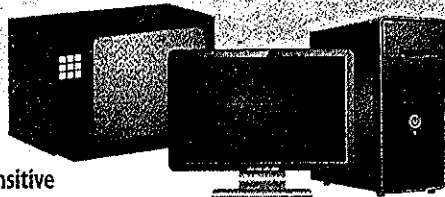


State Computer and TV Disposal Ban Starts January 1, 2011

On January 1, 2011, televisions and computers, including laptops and monitors will be banned from all landfills and incinerators in New Jersey.

- No resident can place these items in their trash.
- No waste hauler can collect them with trash.

The ban is mandated by the 2009 State Electronic Waste Management Act



Be safe – remove any sensitive information from your computer before recycling.
